## #HeForShe Featured Speaker



**Lt Col Becky "Buffy" Ohm** began her career at the 180th Fighter Wing in January 1993 where she was assigned to the Aircraft Maintenance Squadron as a flight line crew chief. In 1994, she was selected for a pilot slot at the 180th Fighter Wing, becoming the first female fighter pilot at the 180th Fighter Wing and within the state of Ohio. Col Ohm has been on several combat deployments and received the Air

Medal in support of Operations Northern Watch, Southern Watch and Iraqi Freedom.

Col Ohm has combined her love of flying with an entrepreneurial spirit and in 2007 opened an aviation themed coffee shop with her husband John in Perrysburg, Ohio. She has been the main force behind the success of her business, "The Flying Joe", acting as the chief financial officer, public relations officer, marketing director, and bookkeeper.

Col Ohm is a 1995 graduate of Bowling Green State University. She attended Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training in Columbus, Mississippi where she met her husband, John. As a Drill Status Guardsman, Col Ohm has been able to be successful in her roles as a commander, pilot, business owner and her most important role as mother of three Zachary, Olivia and Emily.
