



- To inform our local governments, politicians, and community leaders about the needs of women in our area.

# STRATEGY to support research findings to begin implementation in 2021

#### **Network Gap**

With the support from Toledo Rotary Foundation and Toledo Business Growth Collaborative Funding Pool, we introduced an **Accelerator Fund to bridge the network gap.** 

#### Women Advocacy

We established a special Responsive Advocacy Task Force to explore forming a Gender Equity Coalition in addition to support, and assist in educating, engaging, and empowering our female community (and HeForShe) pertaining to our current political, economic and social issues.
